People Like Me



How our learning will link to our children's lives, interests and experiences

All About Me posters made at home form the basis of getting to know each other, learning what's the same or different about me and my new friends. Knowing about mine and others' feelings and how we help ourselves and each other to feel better if we are experiencing negative emotions.

Being introduced to the different areas of the classroom enables children to select what and where they'd like to play.

Fine motor skills equip and refine children's ability to use their hands to dress, eat, write and manipulate tools.

All of these are essential for children's growing independence.

How our learning will link to the wider world

- Knowing how to contribute to the Nursery society helps children feel like they belong and enables them to make a valuable contribution as a young citizen. In particular this will involve following hygiene & other safety procedures.
- Understanding about their own and others preferences helps children learn to empathise with others and see things from other people's perspective. This helps them to become a good friend to others.
- Learning about the reason for rules helps children to learn how to manage and take risks themselves within set boundaries and expectations.

- Children will be focussing on tuning in to sounds they hear from instruments, environment and in words.
- We will sing number songs & rhymes to develop counting skills & rhyming skills.
