## Forest School

Forest School happens in all weathers (unless extreme and deemed unsafe by the leader) including snow, rain and heat. If it is your child's Forest school day please assume it will happen whatever the weather and ensure you send your child with appropriate clothing for the weather on that day for your child to change into for their forest school session. Children will get dirty, muddy and wet so please ensure the clothes you send in are old ones that you do not mind getting muddy. Even when the weather is hot children need long trousers and a long sleeved top to wear in the forest.



**Children in Year 2 and Year 1** need to bring the following named items in a named bag:

- Wellingtons
- Long trousers and a long sleeved top
- Jumper/Sweatshirt
- Waterproof coat and trousers
- Hat, gloves and thick socks in Autumn/Winter months
- Baseball cap / cap with visor in Summer

**Children in Reception** need to bring in Wellingtons in a named bag

**Children in Nursery** need to come appropriately dressed for Forest School

**When your children grow out of their wellies we would be very grateful to have them in school as spares – please bring them to the school office**

Please ensure all items of clothing are named but particularly coats, sweatshirts and cardigans as now that the weather is finally warming up children are taking these off when out playing. We encourage the children to take responsibility for their own clothes so please support us with this.
