

Water Bottles



Sun Hats and Sun Cream



Local Regiment March Past




Earlier this year, Broxbourne Borough Council granted Honorary Freeman status to the Royal Anglian Regiment. On Sunday 2nd July, the Regiment will be exercising their new right to march through the Borough with colours flying, bands playing, drums beating and bayonets fixed.

Approximately 100 soldiers, accompanied by a marching band, will march at 10am from The Spotlight, Hoddesdon to Hoddesdon High Street where they will take the salute from the Mayor of Broxbourne and the Regimental Colonel at the Jubilee Shelter. They will then march to the Hoddesdon War Memorial before returning to the Spotlight for a VIP reception. The march is kindly sponsored by CEG and Residential Property Management.

This will be a historic event in the life of the Borough. We hope that there will be a large crowd in Hoddesdon's High Street to celebrate and recognise the commitment of our local regiment.

Mumps

Please note the following message from Public Health England:

In recent weeks across the country there has been a significant increase in reported cases of mumps among adolescents and young adults. Mumps is a viral illness that is spread by coughs and sneezes or close contact with someone who already has the infection. Older children, teenagers and young adults who have never previously had MMR vaccine or have only had one dose of it, should contact their GP surgery to arrange to catch up with outstanding doses. Those who have already had one dose of MMR vaccine as a young child will only need one further dose, no matter how long ago a first dose was given. Library – Summer Reading Challenge

Hertfordshire libraries are getting their magnifying glasses ready. Why? Animal Agents are coming, as part of the 2017 Summer Reading Challenge. It is the UK's biggest promotion of children reading; last year over 20,000 Hertfordshire children took part-and it's free.

The children are challenged to read six library books or eBooks of their choice during the holidays. For every two books they read, they are rewarded two stickers. When they have completed the challenge, they will receive a wristband and are invited to a presentation ceremony where they will be given their certificate and medal. In addition, participants will have the opportunity to win tickets to an exclusive author event. The Summer Reading Challenge materials are suitable for visually impaired children.

Animal Agents packs will be available in all Hertfordshire public libraries from Saturday 15 July while stocks last, finishing on Saturday 9 September.
