Forest school and PE timetable

Forest School:

Forest school sessions for next half term will be for children in **Reception** and **Nursery** children:

Your child must come dressed for forest school on the day their session is due to take place. Forest school sessions take place in all weathers including snow, rain and heat so please always assume your child's session will take place.

- Legs must be covered (eg full length leggings or joggers)
- A long-sleeved top (jumper, sweatshirt or long-sleeved T-shirt in warmer weather)
- A warm waterproof coat
- Hat and gloves (In colder weather)
- Wellies in a named plastic bag together with a spare change of clothing in case your child gets wet or muddy

Please ensure your child's wellies are cleaned after each forest school session. We have attached a Be Free Forest School guide to help you ensure your child has the correct clothing for their sessions.

PE:

Children should come to school dressed in their PE uniform on their allocated PE days. PE will take place whenever the weather allows. Please dress your child in the following for their PE lesson:

- Black/navy shorts, leggings or joggers
- White or light blue T-shirt
- School jumper/cardigan
- Trainers

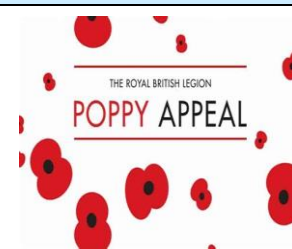

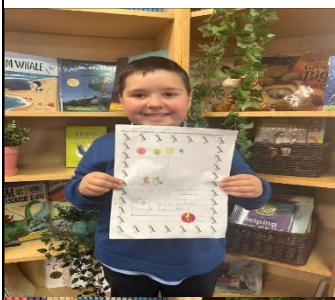


VIP visits

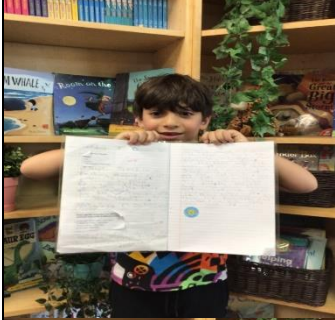
The children were very pleased to share their hard work with Miss Mitchell last week during her VIP visits to classrooms in Year 1 and 2.



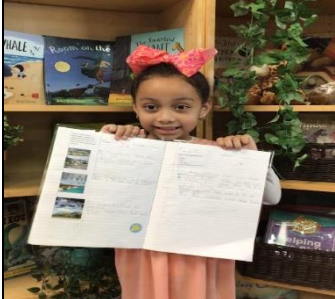
Phoenix in year one was so proud of his writing because he had written so much! Well done Phoenix for being independent in your writing!

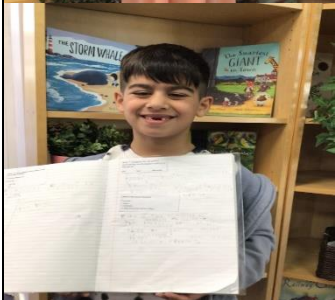

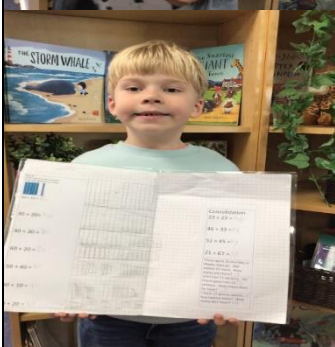


Emelia was so proud of all of her work. She showed me how she had shown perseverance in lots of different pieces of work just like Calvin our Perseverance Superhero!

Visit 1:

- your child shows us their library membership card **or**
- your child joins the library. (For new members we will need to see proof of a parent/carer's name & address e.g. an energy bill, council tax bill or rent agreement)
- they choose and borrow 1 or more books
- then they ask library staff for the first 2 'paw stamps' on their bookmark

At home: have fun sharing the book(s) together

Visit 2:

- return the book(s) to the library
- tell staff about your favourite book,
- collect 2 more paw print stamps on your bookmark
- enter the prize draw. We have signed copies of 'The search for the Giant Arctic Jellyfish by Chloe Savage to win

Children love to choose their own books, and it's **free to join** and borrow books from the library – just remember to bring them back on time or renew them if you want them for longer. You can find the opening times of all the Hertfordshire Libraries at www.hertfordshire.gov.uk/libraries
