

Spring 2 Year 1

We will be learning about poetry and through the story On the Way Home by Jill Murphy



How our learning will link to Year 1 children's lives, interests and experiences

This term year 1 will be reading the story 'Dear Earth'. The children will consider how to look after our environment and the world around us. We will be taking part in a Lost in the Toy Museum workshop to support our learning of toys in History. We hope to walk as a class to a nearby park to look at playground equipment and explore how they are constructed for our DT project.

Learning in the subjects

- In English we are focusing on writing our Super Sentences with capitals, fingers spaces and end punctuation (.?!) . This term we will be writing letters and writing our own version of On the Way Home.
- In Maths we will be learning to measure length and height by using non-standard measurements such as cubes and then using a centimetre ruler. We will be measuring weight and volume too.
- In History we will be learning about Toys in the Past and looking at how toys have changed over time.
- In DT we will be creating a 3D structure of a piece of playground equipment.
- In Art we will learn how to mix primary colours purposefully to make secondary colours.

- To understand place value up to 50 and apply this to solve problems 10+7 =17, 5+30=35
- To form numbers correctly
- To count in 2s 5s and 10s and make combinations of money up to 20p and beyond

Notice when reading and write words using these phonic digraphs: 'aw' (claw) 'au' (auto) 'al'

aw (ciaw) au (auто) a (walk) = "or"

'ir' (bird) 'er' (fern) 'ear'

(early) = 'ur'
'ou' (cloud) = 'ow'

ou (cioua) - ow

'oi' (toy) = 'oy'
